10:35 Keynote	Experience with ink stained bank notes Ink staining systems shall dye the bank notes in the ATM cassettes after an ATM explosive attack, making the cash largely unusable. The speech will show the experience of the German National Bank (Deutsche Bundesbank) on handling such banknotes.
